Historic Milwaukie Neighborhood Minutes of the February 14, 2005 Meeting

- Ray Bryan updated the attendees on Senate bill 295. Currently money collected from traffic tickets are retained by the city, extra dollars go into the general fund for the city. Senate bill 295 would require the extra dollars to go to the state.
- Paul Shirey, City Engineering Director, provided an update on traffic management for Historic Milwaukie. City has \$40,000 budgeted for traffic calming in the neighborhood to address cut through traffic and speeding. Paul and the attendees discussed needing multiple alternatives to address the traffic issues. Planning for the traffic calming would begin in the next few months. A workgroup of neighborhood representatives will meet with Paul to assist in address the traffic issues.
- Mary Rowe, City liason, provided an update on the status of annexation of the Town Center. Also provided an update on the Fire District annexation, city efforts to clarify that if annexation is approved, city can't raise taxes unless citizens vote to raise taxes.
